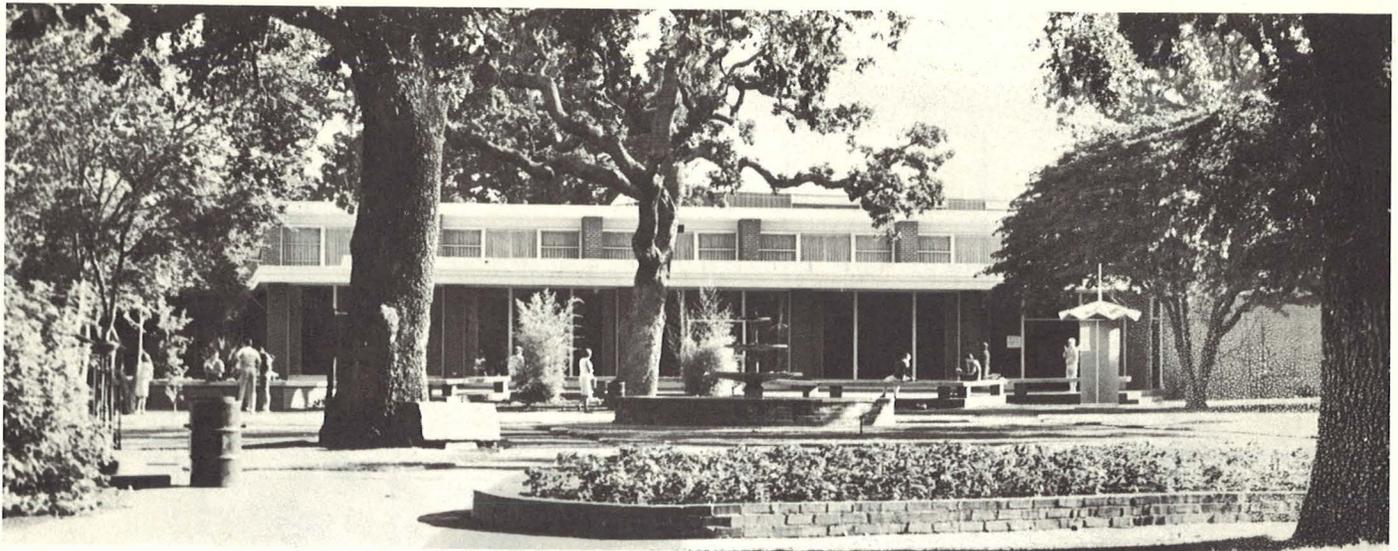

COMPETITION RALLY  
Rules and Regulations for Skits

1. Rally will be set for November 17 at noon on the outdoor stage if weathr permits. There will be a \$5.00 entrance fee which will be refunded if your skit is performed in the competition rally. Deadline for entrance is November 8, 3:00 p.m. Sign-up sheet is in the activities Office.
2. The number of clubs to perform skits will be limited due to the length of the rally. It will be a first come, first served basis. The first 10 clubs to pay their entrance fee will participate in the rally.
3. The contents of the skits are up to your club as long as they are not obscene, and comply with school regulations. The length of the skits will be determined by the number of applicants. A content summary of your skit will be required one week in advance, to be turned into Mr. Canevari. All requests for power outlets or stage etc. shall be requested no later than November 14, 3:00 p.m. Turn requests into Mr. Canevari.
4. All clubs will be responsible for immediate clean-up after their skit so that the next skit can be performed.
5. There will be a requirement of at least 4 clubs to participate in order to have a prize given. The prize will consist of \$25.00 to be given to the winning club during half-time at the Marin-Santa Rosa football game.
6. Any violation of the above rules will automatically disqualify the club.

The first sentence of section entitled Solicitation of Funds or Sponsorship of Fund-Raising Activities of the POLICY STATEMENT OF SPEAKERS, SOLICITATION OF FUNDS, AND DISSEMINATION ~~OF INFORMATION~~ OF INFORMATION ON CAMPUS (May 23, 1966), be interpreted by the Inter-Club Council as applying to those club activities in which funds are solicited, fees are charged or payments in any form are received from groups or persons not members of the sponsoring club, and,

That penalties for violation of this interpretation will be imposed by the Inter-Club Council as follows:

- (1) A fine of \$5.00 for each offense, or,
- (2) Should such a violation cause conflict with, or injury to, groups or persons not members of the violating club, the penalty will be a fine of \$10.00 for each offense, and,
- (3) If fines assessed are not paid by the violating club (or if just cause is not shown before the Inter-Club Council why such a fine is not in order), within two weeks of notification of a fine being levied against them, the violating club will forfeit Inter-Club Council recognition.

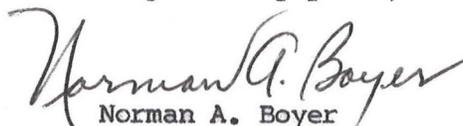

ATTENTION ALL CLUBS

Since there has been some controversy over the rules of the contest the PATRIN is sponsoring, we have decided to change them. According to the previous rules, a club had to sell at least 2 yearbooks per member to qualify to be in the contest, and then after they reached this number they started out from scratch with 0 books to their name. Since this did not seem fair to most of the clubs, we changed the rules to read: Although every club must sell at least 2 books per member to qualify, this number will be added to the total number of books sold by that club. That is, if a club sells 100 books, and they had to sell 40 to qualify, their total number of books sold is 100.

During this contest, clubs will be able to sell both pledge cards and full payments on the yearbooks. Pledge cards will sell for no less than \$1.00. Regular sales of the book, that is the complete payment, will be \$3.00 with a student body card, and \$3.50 without.

This contest will end December 5, unless the PATRIN staff decides to continue it because of the late start we got on selling them.

SANTA ROSA JUNIOR COLLEGE

HYDE PARK CODE

Section I - Purpose and Introduction

In accordance with the provisions of the College policy statement on speakers, solicitation of funds, and dissemination of information on campus, the College Student Assembly in cooperation with the Dean of Students establishes this code for the conduct of a campus Hyde Park.

Section II - Operation

Having been delegated the responsibility for operating a Hyde Park program by the Dean of Students, the College Student Assembly vests the control of the program in the assembly commissioner acting in cooperation with the Student Activities Adviser.

Section III - Activities Covered

"Hyde Park activities might include debates, prepared or spontaneous statements, or simple, informal discussion."

Section IV - Place

The place designated for these activities shall be in front of the Doyle Student Center (coop).

Section V - Time

- A) Facilities shall be made available on all days of regularly scheduled classes.
- B) The time for these activities shall commence at noon and remain available for one hour.

Section VI - Equipment

Equipment for Hyde Park shall consist of the following:

- A) Lectern or podium
- B) A sign denoting "HYDE PARK" to designate the place
- C) A sign outlining the rules of courtesy and notice of individual responsibility for slanderous statements.
- D) No power amplification equipment is to be permitted.

Section VII - Privileges and Responsibilities

In order to insure the proper use of a Hyde Park policy, users of this means of communication are guaranteed the rights of free speech and care shall be taken to see that these rights are not abused. Additionally, the rights of other members of the community shall not be abused by the users of Hyde Park in the name of free speech.

It is expected that the privileges, responsibilities, and limitations imposed by the Hyde Park Code will be observed by all users of the facility. Lewd or obscene conduct violates the report of free speech. It is the obligation of the President of the Associated Students, the Activities Advisor, and the Dean of Students, or their duly designated representative, to require observance of the Hyde Park Code.

Section VIII - Eligibility

The use of Hyde Park facilities shall be limited to the following persons:

- A) Any student enrolled in at least one day course in which at least one unit of credit is given at Santa Rosa Junior College.
- B) Any member of the Santa Rosa Junior College faculty.
- C) Any member of the Administration or Board of Trustees.
- D) Any member of the classified staff of the College.

Section IX - Rules of Courtesy

- A) Five minutes shall be deemed a maximum courteous time for speaking if others desire to use facilities.
- B) Persons should show care for the equipment provided, not damaging, altering or removing.

Section X - Rules of Slander

A copy of a statement by the Sonoma County Council concerning "fair play" and slander shall be reproduced, and made available to each speaker using Hyde Park facilities. Copies shall be made available at the lectern and at the Student Activities Office.

Section XI - Miscellaneous Policies

- A) Activities are not required to be scheduled; however, notification of planned speeches, etc., to the Assemblies Commissioner can be made for coordination purposes.
- B) Any eligible person may commence to use Hyde Park facilities at any time during its operation, on a first come, first serve basis.

Section XII - Adoption, Revision, and Repeal

This code shall be effective the first Monday following its adoption by the College Student Assembly and the Dean of Students. Its contents may be revised or repealed by joint action of the College Student Assembly and the Dean of Students.

I. Presentation of Award

- A. The award shall be presented to the club at the I.C.C. meeting two weeks before "dead week"
- B. The award shall consist of a perpetual placque on which the name of the Best Club shall be placed, and a small trophy which may be retained by the club receiving the award.

II. METHOD of Selecting Best Club.

- A. The judging committee shall be composed of: Dean of Students, Student Activities Advisor, one member of CSA elected by CSA, and one member of ICC elected by ICC.
- B. It will be the sole responsibility of those clubs participating to present to the judging committee upon request a resume of activities that were done inclusive of the semester being judged.
  1. Resumes must include material which substantiates the activity.
  2. Resumes must be organized according to the structure of the point system by which judging will be guided.
- C. The judging committee shall use as a guideline for selecting the Best Club Trophy Award Point System set forth in Section III of this Code.
- D. The decision of the judging committee shall be final.

- I. Call to Order

The meeting was adjourned at 1:00.

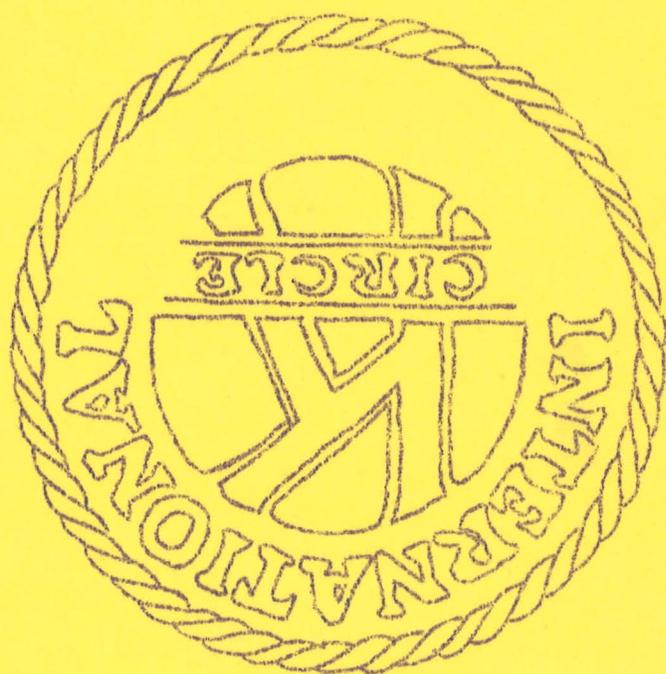
