

- APPROVAL OF AGENDA THE AGENDA WAS APPROVED AS SUBMITTED.
- APPROVAL OF MINUTES THE MINUTES WERE CORRECTED TO CHANGE PART B. UNDER REPORTS FROM VICE CHAIRMAN TO PARLIAMENTARIAN, NICKERBOCKER TO KNICKERBOCKER, STICE TO STIKES. THERE WAS A PASSED MOTION WHICH WAS LEFT OUT OF THE MINUTES, THIS WAS THE MOTION TO RECID ALL FINES A CLUB MIGHT HAVE AT THE END OF THE SPRING SEMESTER. THERE WILL BE NO CARRY OVER FINES INTO THE FALL SEMESTER.

B. BEST CLUB TROPHY COMMITTEE

ONE I.C.C. MEMBER IS ELECTED TO THE COMMITTEE TO HELP DECIDE ON THE AWARD WINNER. RICHARD BRANTINGHAM CALLED ON MR. CANIVERI TO EXPLAIN ABOUT THE COMMITTEE. THE BLACK STUDENT UNION- THE STUDENTS WISHING TO FORM THIS CLUB CAME BEFORE THE I.C.C. TODAY TO TRY AND GET THEIR CONSTITUTION PASSED. RALPH LEEF SPOKE OF THE MORAL PRINCIPLES INVOLVED ON THE ISSUE. HE STATED IT TO BE UNAMERICAN RICHARD ASKED RALPH TO PLEASE DIRECT HIS STATEMENTS TO THE CONSTITUTION ITSELF AND NOT TO THE RESULTS IT MAY OR MAY NOT HAVE. JOHN CLARK ADDRESSED THE CHAIR AND ASKED THAT THE I.C.C MEMBERS VOTE ONLY ON THE CONSTITUTION ITSELF AND NOT ON THE POSSIBILITIES THAT MAY OCCUR. THERE WAS MUCH DISCUSSION ON THE SUBJECT OF SEGREGATION IF THIS WERE TO PASS, SOMEONE POINTED OUT THAT THE CONSTITUTION DISCRIMINATED TOO MUCH AGAINST THE WHITE STUDENTS. THERE WAS A POINT BROUGHT OUT THAT IN THIS CLUB, ACCORDING TO THE WAY THE CONSTITUTION WAS WORDED THERE WOULD NOT BE AN EQUAL VOICE IN THE CLUB. THERE WAS A MOTION MADE TO POSTPONE THE VOTING UNTIL THE FOLLOWING MEETING. MR. CANIVERI MADE THE SUGGESTION TO EITHER LET THE CLUB IN OR OUT BUT DON'T KEEP THEM WAITING. THERE WAS A POINT BROUGHT UP THAT BY POSTPONEMENT, THE CLUB WOULD NOT HAVE A CHANCE TO GET SIGNUPS ON CLUB DAY. THERE WAS A MOTION TO VOTE ON THE POSTPONEMENT, THERE WAS MORE DISCUSSION AND MR. CANIVERI SUGGESTED THAT THE CLUB BE AT LEAST ALLOWED TO OBTAIN SIGN UP MEMBERS ON CLUB DAY. THERE WAS ANOTHER MOTION AND A SECOND TO VOTE ON THE POSTPONEMENT, BY ROLL CALL VOTE, THE MOTION WAS DENIED. THERE WAS MORE DISCUSSION ON THE MORAL ASPECT OF THE CONSTITUTION. SOME MEMBER POINTED OUT THE FACT THAT NOT ENOUGH TIME HAD BEEN GIVEN TO READ AND STUDY THE CONSTITUTION. ANOTHER MEMBER THAUGHT IT WAS TOO DISCRIMINATING AGAINST WHITE STUDENTS JOINING. THERE WAS A MOTION AND A SECOND TO VOTE ON THE CONSTITUTION. THERE WAS ANOTHER ROLL CALL VOTE AND THE MOTION FAILED. THERE WAS A POINT BROUGHT OUT THAT THE CONSTITUTION BE AMMENDED AND BROUGHT BEFORE THE COMMITTEE NEXT MEETING.



Year of Decision

In his narrative history (a best seller 25 years ago), "The Year of Decision: 1846," Bernard De Voto tells the stories of many of the incredibly brave men, women and children who made the westward trek. He tells the epic story of the Americans who pioneered the Santa Fe, the Oregon and the California trails. He tells the stories of the men who fought at the Alamo and many other half-forgotten battles, to finally bring the states of New Mexico, Texas and California into our great Union.

Who among us can turn our backs on such a rich American Heritage and, for even one moment, listen to the screams of the screamers, just because they can't stand the thought of trying to be loyal, law-abiding Americans?

We are warned to expect teachers' strikes and student disorders this year. These are in addition to the usual crop sown by the "activists" who think American campuses are fertile soil for planting the seeds of hate.

Teachers' strikes have started with the start of the school year and we are told that they will take place all over the country, aided by teacher-sponsored student disorders.

Watch Carefully

This semester we commemorate 50 years of vision and intelligent work which has made our college one of the finest Junior Colleges in the nation. We also acknowledge, with pride, the award which names our "Oak Leaf" the best Junior College publication in the United States.

Our decision will be required on this question: "Shall we continue our healthy, intelligent progress, in keeping with the times (we know they have changed), or shall we rush madly to join the "Students For You Name It and We'll Start It?"


Press and TV





TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

Welcome to the latest battlefield in the Academic War. To the best of my knowledge this is the only campus where the Student President stands for law, order and justice for the student body which he represents and a few of the faculty stands for rebellion against student government, recalling student officers and preventing segregation from being outlawed, all for the sake of 33 of a total of 3700 students. We have heard of the tail trying to wag the dog but this is ridiculous.

The black student leader, John Clark, was appointed by me to a position in student government. White students have nowhere near the ratio of 1 in 33. How can this be classed as a 'token' appointment? The ratio for white students is less than 1 in 100.

Clark handed out statements of intent showing the goals the Black Student Union intended to work for. They included: a seperate black force, on and off campus, creation of black power and most repulsive of all, the freeing of black people from the goals of White Society. They were informed immediately by me---and the Student Activities Advisor that this would not be allowed. They produced another statement of intent very quickly which said that membership would be open. I was informed, unofficially that white membership would be discouraged.

Knowing that this activity had been in the planning stage all summer, in a special class for these students under sponsorship of those faculty members who are now trying to disrupt the student government I had little faith in their sudden change in order to get a charter. I advised the Inter Club Council to refuse the charter of any segregated group and they so decided. Some of the faculty decided, however, that student government should exist only so long as it remains in a kneeling position.

The black student union was planned as a segregated black power structure and it is reasonable to believe that black segregation will not serve to further their drive for recognition.

If a person who opposes segregation can be called a racist, or racist pig, as happened, why is our federal government spending billions to prevent segregation?

Had I refrained from participation in student affairs and confined my efforts to my studies, I have every reason to believe that I would have maintained my usual 'fair to middling' average. It would be foolish indeed to drop my fight for the integrity of student government since so many of my classes are taught by sponsors of the black power movement and I see little hope of hope of making the Dean's Honor List.

If, by some Miscarriage of justice, the will of 33 segregationists should prevail over 3700 non-segregationists, I will still have the one thing I cherish: an A, for Americanism.


Dear Mr. Leef:

Your most recent public statement dated October 1, 1968, addressed To Whom It May Concern, compels a statement on my part. Your remarks were distributed after information was personally conveyed to you last week, on a first occasion by the adviser to student activities and on the second occasion by myself, with reference to the established procedures through which complaints against faculty members may be properly lodged and investigated.

I am strongly supportive of student government, and after 20 years of close association with it, I have great confidence in the integrity of judgment and action arising from its operation. The controversy over recognition of the proposed Black Student Union originated within the framework of student government, and it is within that framework that it should be resolved. This does not deny the ultimate authority vested in the Board of Trustees by the Education and other applicable codes with respect to rules and regulations governing this institution.

I do not dispute for one minute your right or your responsibility publicly to take stands, argue for your convictions, or urge specific action based on the logic of your arguments. You have proceeded, however, in your release of October 1, to impugn the integrity of faculty members by implying they will take punitive action against you for your student activity by giving you lower grades than you really earn. You have accused faculty sponsors and participants involved in the College Readiness Program, strongly supported by the administration and trustees, of planning disruptive activity. If you wish to file complaints in accordance with the procedures outlined to you, do so and proper investigation will be undertaken and judgments rendered. Otherwise, you do a disservice to this college and yourself by continuing to make unsupported attacks on members of the faculty and, in your October 1 statement, on the College Readiness Program which has our strong backing.

Art IV. Faculty Advisor

Faculty Advisor shall be Recommended by the Executive Bd. and by the members for appointment by the Chairman with a two-third majority approval of the Executive Bd. each semester.

Art VII. Election and Eligibility of Officers

- Sec. 1. Election of Officers shall be at the second meeting of each semester.
- Sec. 2. No Officers shall hold the same office for more than two consecutive semesters.

Art VIII Impeachment

Any officer may be removed by a two-thirds vote of the membership.

Art IX. This Constitution will become effective when ratified by a two-thirds vote of the membership voting and when approved by I.C.C.

Amendments to this Constitution may be made when approved by a two-thirds vote of the membership voting.

Parliamentary procedure will be according to Sturgis' (2nd edition) Quorum shall be one over half the total membership.

CONSTITUTION

LATTER-DAY SAINT STUDENT ASSOCIATION

Santa Rosa Junior College

PREAMBLE

The members of the Latter Day Saint Student Association, in order to provide a program of activities for all members and give service to our school and community, do ordain and establish this constitution.

ARTICLE I.

NAME

The name of this organization shall be Latter Day Saint Student Association Club of Santa Rosa Junior College.

ARTICLE II.

PURPOSE

The purpose of this Club shall be to cooperate with all clubs and organizations on campus for the benefit of the entire school and community, and to engage in a variety of activities lending to a close unity and companionship of all the students in the Club.

ARTICLE III.

DUES

Dues shall be \$5.00 for the school year, or \$3.00 per semester.

ARTICLE IV.

OFFICERS

All officers shall serve a term of two semesters.

PRESIDENT: The President shall call regular meetings and preside over them, and appoint all committee chairmen, with the consent of the membership.

VICE PRESIDENT: The Vice President shall assume the duties of the President in his or her absence and call a special election if the President is no longer able to serve.

SECRETARY: The Secretary shall record the minutes of all meetings, write all necessary letters, and take care of all Club funds, keeping accurate records of the Club expenditures.

ICC REPRESENTATIVE: The ICC representative will attend the ICC meetings weekly and keep notes in order to report proceedings of the ICC to the Club.

ARTICLE V.

MEETINGS

The time of regular meetings shall be every tuesday and friday from 12 P.M. until 1 P.M.

ARTICLE VI.

QUORUM

A quorum will be constituted by one-half of the enrolled membership plus one member. A quorum must be present in order that a meeting be held and business conducted.

ARTICLE VII.

ELECTION OF OFFICERS

Club officers shall be elected from the membership each year at the beginning of the Fall semester of school. Candidates for offices will be nominated during a regular meeting of the Club. The majority rule will be used in the voting procedure.

ARTICLE VIII.

IMPEACHMENT

Failure on the part of an officer to uphold any or all of the preamble and the articles of this constitution will provide sufficient basis for impeachment. The impeachment of an officer shall require the support of at least two-thirds of the membership in a vote to be held during a regular meeting of the Club.

ARTICLE IX.

AMMENDMENTS

Ammendments to this constitution may be made by a two-thirds vote of the membership and the approval of the ICC.

ARTICLE X.

RATIFICATION

Ratification of this constitution shall require the yes vote of at least two-thirds of the Club membership and the approval of the ICC.

The Academic Senate of Santa Rosa Junior College passed the following resolution concerning the controversy involving Mr. Ralph Leef, the President of the Associated Students. The resolution originated in a report from the Professional Relations Committee.

Copies of this resolution are being distributed to Mr. Leef, the Associated Students, the Oak Leaf, the faculty and administration, the Board of Trustees, and to the news media.

The Academic Senate of Santa Rosa Junior College herewith registers its disapproval of Mr. Ralph Leef's irresponsible and unsubstantiated public charges against faculty members and agencies of the College and of his failure to follow established procedures for registration of accusations and complaints at Santa Rosa Junior College.

In exercising his rights of academic freedom he has not assumed the following responsibilities as stated in the Guidelines attached to the academic freedom statement adopted by the Santa Rosa Junior College Board of Trustees. Those Guidelines specifically not followed include No. 7, The Responsibility of Institution, The Student and Teacher agree to abide by regulations of the College....which procedures were not followed; and No. 5, The Responsibility of Respect,....none would seek to degrade or demean another's person. Vague charges and innuendos in Mr. Leef's documents did "degrade and demean another's person".

We believe that the acceptance of Academic Freedom by the College community automatically carries with it Academic Responsibility. Our conclusion is that Mr. Leef has fallen short in this regard.

This statement of disapproval of Mr. Leef's behavior is not concerned with judgments regarding the Black Student Union's application for student recognition since this is in the province of the student body.

6.10 Policy Statement on Speakers, Solicitation of Funds, and Dissemination of Information on Campus

A. Speakers Invited to Address an Organization During Its Own Meeting

An invitation, sanctioned by the organization and its adviser, is all that is necessary. This type of presentation is deemed to be similar to a guest speaker in a scheduled class.

B. Off-Campus Speakers Invited to Address the Student Body in An Assembly-Type Program

The Committee for an Open Forum is the agency of the college which has the responsibility of sponsoring assembly-type presentations on controversial issues. The policy and procedures outlined for the Committee and made a part of this section will govern such presentations. (See Appendix 1 of this section.)

The Mid-Day Series Committee and the Public Service Program will continue to schedule speakers on topics of general interest.

A student organization may sponsor an off-campus speaker in an assembly-type program if authorization is granted by the Inter-Club Council. The policy and procedures governing such presentations are made a part of this section. (See Appendix 2 of this section.)

C. A "Hyde Park" Forum for Students and Employees of the District

An appropriate location will be designated and a pre-determined time for presentations (formal or informal) by faculty members, students, administrators, trustees, or members of the classified staff of the college. The "Hyde Park" activities are confined to members of the college community and may include debates, prepared or spontaneous statements or simply informal discussion. Any organization or individual wishing to be assured time for a presentation at the "Hyde Park" may reserve time through the office of the Dean of Students. A statement prepared by the County Counsel, including reminders of "fair play" and libelous, slanderous, or illegal actions will be brought to the attention of users of the facility. (See Appendix 3 of this section.)

D. Dissemination of Information on Campus

Every bulletin board on campus will be assigned jointly by the Deans of Students and Instruction to a department, office, organization, or individual or be given an "open" classification. Use of assigned boards will be at the discretion of the assignee. Boards labeled "open" may be used for publicizing on or off campus events of public interest.

Leaflets and similar material may be freely distributed on the Doyle Student Center patio by campus organizations. Distribution of material elsewhere on campus may be scheduled

through the office of the Dean of Students. Individuals who desire to distribute materials may request an organization's sponsorship through the Inter-Club Council. The sponsoring organization, together with its adviser, may facilitate the distribution of the materials, without necessarily subscribing to the point of view presented.

Off-campus groups or individuals presenting approved assembly-type programs may distribute but not sell literature related to the topic under discussion or the purposes of the organization represented. The literature may be distributed at that location from which the program will be presented and/or continued during a question/answer period.

E. Solicitation of Funds or Donations or Sponsorship of Fund-Raising Activities

The solicitation of funds or donations, or sponsorship of fund-raising activities either on or off campus is permitted only upon approval of the Inter-Club Council. Off-campus groups or individuals presented by an agency of the college are not permitted to sell literature or other items or to collect funds by other means while on the campus. Any campus organization which collects funds from its members or other sources will maintain an account with the Associated Students so proper records are kept for all deposits and disbursements. Use of the funds shall be at the discretion of the organization.

F. Financial Responsibility

Any activity sponsored by a campus organization after approval by the Inter-Club Council is the exclusive financial responsibility of the organization. Any such activity for which the organization does not have required funds on deposit and which involves a commitment of \$50 or more shall be subject to the approval of the Dean of Students. Approval will involve filing by the parties involved of a written statement releasing the college and Associated Students from any financial claim or responsibility.

* * * * *

Sponsors of the various programs and activities have a responsibility to insure that the normal educational program or conduct of the affairs of the college are not disrupted.

Care should be taken to have all authorized programs and events scheduled on the college activities calendar. Provision for adequate facilities and necessary equipment should be assured well in advance of the activity.

Guidelines for a Student Organization Desiring to Sponsor an Off-Campus Speaker in an Assembly-Type Program

1. A request for authorization shall be submitted to the Inter-Club Council on a form provided by the Student Activities Adviser.
2. A facility shall be reserved through the Office of the College President with arrangements made for special needs.
3. The speaker shall be informed:
 - a. Approval for his appearance on campus is granted for the purpose of his speaking on the announced topic for which the request was submitted to the Inter-Club Council.
 - b. The program may or may not be taped depending on whether or not a request originates from an agency or individual on campus (i.e., Committee for an Open Forum, Student Activities Adviser, or the sponsoring organization.)
4. Groups or an individual invited to the campus will be informed of the right to distribute literature related to the topic or to the purpose of the organization and of the prohibition against the sale of literature or other items or the collection of funds. Leaflets and similar materials may be distributed at that location from which the program will be presented and/or continued during a question/answer period or on the patio of the Doyle Student Center by the sponsoring student organization.
5. A member of the sponsoring club or organization or its adviser will preside at each program. He will introduce the speaker and will recognize students for questions upon termination of the presentation. The presiding officer will not allow students to make speeches from the "floor" in lieu of asking questions. In the instance of a presiding student, the club or organization adviser will be present in the audience.
6. Each program will terminate within the hour. A question and answer session, engaging the speaker and students, can be arranged following the general program if a separate meeting area can be scheduled.
7. All programs are open to the total campus community, but the general public is not invited to attend because the purpose of the programs is to provide an opportunity for speakers to address students.
8. Because the sponsoring club or organization and its adviser is responsible for guests during their campus presence, the club or club adviser reserves the right to terminate appearances of guests at any time during which threatened or actual interruptive tactics cause disruption.
9. In the event of anticipated trouble before a program, the club or organization or its adviser will notify college officials for purposes of developing, cooperatively, precautionary measures.

- C. The judging committee shall use as a guideline for selecting the Best Club Trophy Award Point System set forth in Section III of this Code.
- D. The decision of the judging committee shall be final.
