CSA — COLLEGE STUDENT ASSEMBLY — *The main legislative body of the Associated Students composed of all Associated Students elected and appointed officers.*



MID-DAY SERIES — *Lectures and programs of artistic and intellectual importance.*





19 February 1968

Minutes

- I. CALL TO ORDER
The meeting was called to order at 12:12 by Chairman Bob Evans.
- II. ROLL CALL
Absent to roll call were: Caduceans, Christian Varsity, Current Affairs, Hawaiian Club, Interfaith, International Relations, Psychology Club, and T.P.R.
- III. APPROVAL OF THE AGENDA
The agenda was approved as written.
- IV. READING AND APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES
The minutes were approved as written.
- V. REPORTS:
- A. CHAIRMAN
Bob welcomed the reps to I.C.C. He announced that the purpose of I.C.C. is to promote communication between the clubs for the general betterment of the college as a whole.

Bob announced that he had received a letter from Pacific tours regarding Spring vacations to Mazatlan, Mexico. He asked any interested club to see him after the meeting.

Bob added that attendance in I.C.C. is mandatory for all recognized clubs on campus. He directed any club who had any questions to see the I.C.C. secretary.
- B. PARLIAMENTARIAN
I.C.C. Parliamentarian, Ted Drew announced that I.C.C. would follow Sturgis Standard Code of Parliamentary Procedure. He asked any rep who had a question regarding the procedure of any meeting to rise to a "point of parliamentary procedure". He added that there was a chart on motions, precedence of, in the binders that would be furnished later.
- C. C.S.A. PRESIDENT
Norman Boyer, Spring 1968 ASB President, added his welcome to the reps in I.C.C. He added that he felt that I.C.C. has great potential, but only if the clubs and reps are willing to work. *I.C.C. award to Best Club Award was passed by C.S.A.*
- D. SECRETARY
I.C.C. Secretary, Alice Fish, announced that all club reps to I.C.C. would receive a binder containing all pertinent data that would be of interest to the clubs. The binders were available, to reps only, after the meeting.

She announced that all clubs who were called on the roll sheet are presently recognized in I.C.C.; also that 7 clubs did not have constitutions on file in the Student Activities Office. They are: Auto Service, Delta Psi Omega, Electronics Club, L.D.S.S.A., M.L.C., S.B.C., and W.L.C. The needed constitutions (2 copies) must be filed in the Student Activities Office no later than March 4, 1968, or the club will lose recognition in I.C.C. If any club is in doubt as to whether the constitution on file is the correct one, they should see either Bob Evans, or Alice Fish in the Student Activities Office.

Alice announced that fines imposed on clubs for absenteeism in I.C.C. last semester were now void under the present I.C.C. Code.

Alice added that club information sheets are due in the Student Activities Office By Friday, at the latest. She asked that any club who did not hand one in would not be on the master list of clubs on file in the Student Activities Office.

E. ADVISOR

Mr. Canevari, Student Activities Advisor, added his welcome to the new I.C.C. members. He asked all clubs to check their mailboxes in the Student Activities Office at least once a week.

He also asked each of the club reps to check over their constitutions to see if it allows for the election of new officers the previous semester. If it doesn't, then he suggested that they change it for the Club's own good.

He added that College Night is March 29, and that he needs clubs to help the Student Activities Office.

VI. OLD BUSINESS

A. BEST CLUB TROPHY AWARD

It was moved and seconded to refer to committee the funding of the Best Club Trophy Award, to draw up a resolution requesting funds from C.S.A. to purchase a perpetual plaque and one small individual trophy. Motion passed.

Bob appointed Vets Club, SBC, WLC, and Delphi reps to the committee, with Vets Club as chairman. He directed the committee to report by the next I.C.C. meeting.

B. FROM FLOOR

No old business was brought up from the floor.

VII. NEW BUSINESS

A. ELECTION OF I.C.C. VICE-CHAIRMAN

Gerry Hinton was nominated. It was then moved and seconded to close nominations. Motion carried.

Gerry Hinton was elected I.C.C. Vice-Chairman for Spring 1968.

- B. APPROVAL OF SECRETARIAL APPOINTMENT It was moved and seconded that the appointment of Alice Fish as Spring I.C.C. Secretary by approved. Motion carried.
- C. ELECTION OF I.C.C. REP TO C.S.A. Norman Boyer pointed out that the I.C.C. Rep elected should be able to attend both I.C.C. and C.S.A. meetings and be responsible for relaying information regarding each of these organizations to the other.

The election was tabled until the next I.C.C. meeting.

- D. CLUB DAY (Feb. 27) Bob announced that Club Day would be from 11-1 and that all new club members must sign-up at the Student Activities Booth. He also asked that clubs wishing equipment return requisition forms to the Student Activities Office no later than Wednesday, Feb. 21.

- E. BEAR FAIR (May 18) Bob asked the clubs to start planning for Bear Fair.

- F. FROM FLOOR
1. It was pointed out that since the I.C.C. has to elect a member of the Best Club Trophy Award Judging Committee, the reps should start thinking about candidates.

2. It was moved and seconded to refer to committee the funding of a perpetual gavel for I.C.C. to draw up a resolution requesting funds from C.S.A. to purchase a gavel for use in I.C.C.

It was pointed out that now, the I.C.C. Chairman is borrowing the C.S.A. President's gavel.

Motion carried.

Bob directed the Best Club Trophy Award Committee to draw up a resolution requesting funds from C.S.A. for the gavel also.

VIII. MONEY MAKING REQUESTS

1. Home Economics - Mar. 1 from 9-4. La Rose Hotel, rummage sale. Passed.
2. W.L.C. - Feb. 27 - outdoor stage. Box lunch sale. tickets 1-10¢ and 3-25¢. Passed.
3. W.L.C. - Feb. 24 - Lucky Stores in S.R. and Portlocks in Sebastopol. Cake Sale. Passed.
4. SBC and Circle K submitted requests for the same projects: on Feb. 27. Tug-of-war. Entry fee 1¢. It was then moved and seconded to vote simultaneously on the requests, and the club receiving a majority vote would be allowed to sponsor the event.

Bob evans limited debate to 2 speeches for each club. 1st pro was awarded to Circle K.

1. The Circle K rep stated that they ran the tug-of-war last year and did a good job on it, and he felt that since SBC sponsored the chariot race, Circle K should be allowed to sponsor the tug-of-war.
2. The SBC rep stated that the tug-of-war was originally started years ago by SBC. He read past Student Council minutes stating that SBC would run the tug-of-war. He also presented an old plaque and the present trophy showing past winners of the tug-of-war. He showed past publicity on the event received in the local paper. Regarding last year's tug-of-war, SBC pointed out that they officiated.
1. A member of Circle K reminded I.C.C. of the good job they did last semester and showed items from last year's tug-of-war from their scrapbook.
2. SBC pointed out that by sponsoring the chariot race and also wanting to sponsor the tug-of-war, they in no way wish to start a monopoly.
