CSA — COLLEGE STUDENT ASSEMBLY — *The main legislative body of the Associated Students composed of all Associated Students elected and appointed officers.*



December 16, 1969



 - B. Vice-Chairman: Tom Rodella also talked about his participation in the State Conference. There were 75 resolutions for consideration but both Larry and Tom agreed that the conference could have been handled much faster.
 - D. Parliamentarian: Steve Cabot proposed that ICC pass a new constitution from the Chess Club. The chair moved to accept this new constitution for the Chess Club on the recommendations of the Constitution Committee, (which had already approved the Constitution). The motion passed.

C. From the Floor--Buddy Clark reported that a November Actions Committee is being formed by the Current Affairs Club to direct actions for a November protest against the war. On November 12, Bruce Nelson will speak before the Open Forum on the U.S., Viet Nam War and revolution in the 20th Century. On November 13, there will be a rally and assembly at Fremont Square and then a march to the Rosenberg Building. Which is followed by an informational picket at the draft board. Films will be shown on campus on the U.S. and Viet Nam. On November 14, a teach-in will be held. A petition will be circulating to cancel all classes so that the students can participate in the teach-in. There will be speakers and films. On November 15, a peace march will be held in San Francisco and transportation by bus is being arranged at \$2 a person.

IX. Money-Making Requests

money will go to the club itself and the other half will be given to the Deans Loan and Grant Fund.



CONSTITUTION OF THE ORIENTAL CLUB
OF SANTA ROSA JUNIOR COLLEGE

ARTICLE I - NAME

The name of this organization shall be the Oriental Club.

ARTICLE II - OBJECTIVES

The objectives of this organization shall be:

- Section 1. To promote the Asian culture among fellow students, faculty, staff of Santa Rosa Junior College and the community.
- Section 2. To acquaint the students of Asian descent on campus; and assist exchange students of Asian descent in any way possible.
- Section 3. To promote friendship among all students on campus.

ARTICLE III - MEMBERSHIP

- Section 1. Membership in the organization shall be open to any and all students attending the Santa Rosa Junior College.
- Section 2. Membership dues shall be \$2.50 per semester.

ARTICLE IV - OFFICERS

- Section 1. Elected officers shall compose the Executive Chamber and shall consist of: President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, and an InterClub Council representative with one alternate.
- Section 2. Appointed officers are the Social Chairman and the Publicity Chairman. These appointments must be approved by $\frac{1}{2}$ majority of the club members.
- Section 3. The Executive Chamber shall consist of the above mentioned officers plus the Constitution Committee Chairman and faculty adviser (s).

ARTICLE V - DUTIES OF OFFICERS

- Section 1. The President shall preside at all meetings, shall be chairman of the Executive Chamber, and shall appoint temporary officers to fill vacancies with the approval of the Executive Chamber.
- Section 2. The Vice-President shall perform all the duties of the President in his absence. He shall also act as program chairman.

- Section 3. The Secretary shall record and keep up to date the minutes and records, and tend to all correspondence. She shall also record the roll at each meeting.
- Section 4. The Treasurer shall handle all financial matters in accordance with Associated Students financial code. It is also the responsibility of the Treasurer to collect the dues and all imposed fines.
- Section 5. The Publicity Chairman shall publicize all meetings and activities of the organization.
- Section 6. The Social Chairman shall be responsible for the social events of the organization.
- Section 7. The ICC representative shall represent the club at all ICC meetings and inform the club of the activities of the ICC. In his absence, the alternate representative shall attend the ICC meetings.

ARTICLE VI - ELECTION AND IMPEACHMENT

- Section 1. Election of officers shall take place at the last meeting of each semester.
- Section 2. Each candidate must receive a simple majority of the quorum to be elected to office.
- Section 3. In order to impeach an officer of the club, 2/3 of the total membership must vote in favor of impeachment, in which case the impeachment must be passed by a 2/3 majority membership of the Executive Chamber.
- Section 4. No officer may hold the same office for more than two semesters.

ARTICLE VII- FACULTY ADVISER (S)

The organization shall have at least one faculty adviser recommended by the Executive Chamber.

ARTICLE VIII - MEETINGS

- Section 1. The organization shall meet every Friday from 12 noon to 1:00 P.M.
- Section 2. Special meetings may be called by the President or 1/3 of voting members with 24 hours previous notice.

ARTICLE IX - AMENDMENTS

- Section 1. The constitution of this organization may be amended at any general meeting, provided that the proposed amendments are submitted to the Executive Chamber for approval and then in turn submitted in writing to all members at least one week prior to the meeting at which the measure is to be voted upon.
- Section 2. A two-thirds majority vote shall be necessary to enact such amendment after which the ICC must approve it.

X. Announcements


Mr. Canevari wanted a club to volunteer to pass-out newspapers on low-cost housing in the county. Any club interested see Mr. Canevari.

KENT HALL ASSOCIATION

To: The Board of Trustees
Santa Rosa Junior College

As you may recall, the purpose of this final proposal concerning women's visitation hours in Kent Hall housing is to state exactly the proceedings that the previously proposed judiciary committee will follow in the event of a violation of the rules.

We are concerned specifically with the residents' ability to obey the women's visitation hours:

Sunday through Thursday Noon to 9:00 p.m.
and
Friday and Saturday Noon to midnight.

It must be made evident, also, to the residents that there is a woman present in the room they are entering. When a resident checks into the hall, among the articles he will be issued will be a piece of bright colored tape. The purpose of this tape, as will be explained to the resident, will be to place it on the outside of his front door and the inside of the door adjoining the two rooms. The tape will be put up whenever there is a woman present in the room. The tape is to let each roommate know that he is to act in his most cordial manner while in the presence of the woman. If a man is found to have a woman in his room without the signal present, a report will be made and submitted to the judiciary committee.

Who will make out the reports? A schedule will be made, by the president of the hall, of three (3) residents to serve as checkers for a week at a time. Each checker will take one section of the dorm. and check each room at the leaving hour, or at any time he feels is necessary. At the beginning of each new week, three different residents will perform their duties as checkers.

When a report is submitted to the head of the judiciary committee, they will meet and hold a hearing. The judiciary committee will have the power to sentence the resident with any of the following four penalties:

1. Warning
2. Suspend women's visitation privileges
3. Lose \$10 of his \$25
4. Be removed from the housing entirely

The violator may appeal any decision of the committee to the dormitory supervisor--the Assistant Dean of Students. The judiciary committee may levy the sentence they feel is necessary according to the seriousness of the violation.

Proposed Judicial System

The judicial system of the Kent Hall Association will be composed of an Honor System and a Judicial Committee.

Article I Honor System

Section 1. In Whom Vested. The honor system will be composed of the residents of Kent Hall. The responsibilities and powers of this system will be vested in the residents.

Section 2. Duties. It will be the responsibility of each resident to recognize and respect the rules and regulations governing women's visitation hours.

It will be a further responsibility of the residents to serve their term as checker when the period comes up.

Article II Judicial Committee

Section 1. In Whom Vested. The judicial responsibilities and powers of the Kent Hall Association shall be vested in the Judicial Committee.

Section 2. Jurisdiction. The Judicial Committee shall have jurisdiction in all cases arising from infractions of Article I. The Assistant Dean of Students and Board of Trustees, in that order, shall have appellate jurisdiction in all cases.

Section 3. Organization. The Kent Hall Judicial Committee shall consist of five (5) Justices elected by the residents of Kent Hall. One Justice will be elected from the staff of supervisors at Kent Hall. One justice will automatically be the Assistant Dean of Students. All resident Justices must be current residents of Kent Hall. The Chief Justice of the Judiciary Committee, elected by the court from its own membership, shall convene the court and preside at its sessions. In the event of the absence of the Chief Justice, the court shall designate an acting Chief Justice from its own membership who shall preside until the return of the Chief Justice. In the event of a vacancy of office, the President of Kent Hall Association, with the approval of the residents, shall fill the vacancy through appointment.

Section 4. Policy Powers. The Judicial Committee shall establish all judicial policy. The Committee shall adopt the rules for all court proceedings of the Kent Hall Association.

Section 5. Judicial Personnel: Tenure. All elected Justices shall serve for a term of one semester. They shall serve during good behavior so long as they retain residence at Kent Hall.

The judicial system pertains solely to women's visitation hours. The system will be written into the Kent Hall Constitution upon approval by the Kent Hall residents and the institution of revised women's visitation hours.

June 12, 1969

It will be a further purpose of the judiciary committee to rule on any disputes or conflicts among the residents arising from women's visitation hours.

A hearing will be held, and recommendations will be made to the residents to alleviate the problems.

- V. Approval of Minutes
The minutes were approved as written.
- VI. Reports
Chairman--Rich Brantingham introduced next semester's Chairman, Vice President-elect Larry Gibson, who then spoke to ICC.
Rich then discussed Bear Fair, thanking those clubs which helped clean up. He also talked about the past year and the important role of clubs on campus.
Rich then led a standing ovation in appreciation for Mr. Canevari. He thanked all his officers.
Vice Chairman--Fran Blaylock congratulated Delphi for the good job with the Queen Contest.
Parliamentarian--Chris Zeek led ICC in a standing round of applause for Rich Brantingham.
ICC Rep to CSA--Brad Knickerbocker explained and corrected his report, and thanked ICC for giving him the responsibility and privilege of serving in CSA as their representative.
