SUBJECT: Utilization of the present Student Activities Office and present Bookstore area after the completion of Pioneer Hall.

In general, we feel that both the Bookstore area and the Student Activities Office area should be used for some sort of student activity area or student services area. In reflecting on the possible uses for the Bookstore space, we feel that a combination of vending machines, lounge type seating, and recreation ( pool table and ping pong tables ) should be considered for this area.

At this time we would like to ask that an official request be given to Steel & Van Dyk for an investigation of what remodeling it would take to bring the present Bookstore storage room up to Field Act standards so that it can be used for student occupancy. This is a large useful area, but it is our understanding that it was not built to Field Act standards at the time the Bookstore was constructed.

The present Student Activities Office should also be considered for future student activities. We have long needed an area which could easily be converted from one use to another depending upon what the current extra - curricular needs or extra - curricular projects of the students might be. We envision this area as a space which would not necessarily have a permanent function.

We would like to emphasize our position that the area to be vacated should be used for student activities and student services which would include food services, recreation, lounge areas, and space for extra-curricular projects.





Policy Statement on Speakers, Solicitation of Funds, and  
Dissemination of Information on Campus

Adopted: September, 1966  
Amended: April, 1969  
Amended: April, 1971

- A. An invitation, sanctioned by the organization and its adviser is all that is necessary. This type of presentation is deemed to be similar to a guest speaker in a scheduled class.
- B. Off-Campus Speakers Invited to Address the Student Body in An Assembly-Type Program:

The Committee for an Open Forum is the agency of the college which has the responsibility of sponsoring assembly-type presentations on controversial issues. The policy and procedures outlined for the Committee and made a part of this section will govern such presentations. (See Appendix 1 of this section).

The Mid-Day Series Committee and the Public Service Program will continue to schedule speakers on topics of general interest.

A student organization may sponsor an off-campus speaker in an assembly-type program if authorization is granted by the Inter-Club Council Committee on Speakers composed of three members of I.C.C. appointed by the chairman and three faculty members appointed by the Committee on Committees. Any publicly announced program will fall under the "Assembly-type program" category. Approval by the Student Activities Advisor will be sufficient if the Inter-Club Council is unable to act. The policy and procedures governing such presentations and the guidelines for the Inter-Club Council Committee on Speakers are made a part of this section. (See Appendix 2 of this section).

- C. A "Hyde Park" Forum for Students and Employees of the District

An appropriate location will be designated and a pre-determined time for presentations (formal or informal) by faculty members, students, administrators, trustees, or members of the classified staff of the college. The "Hyde Park" activities are confined to members of the college community and may include debates, prepared or spontaneous statements or simply informal discussion. Any organization or individual wishing to be assured time for a presentation at the "Hyde Park" may reserve time through the office of the Dean, Student Personnel Services. A statement prepared by the County Counsel, including reminders of "fair play" and libelous, slanderous, or illegal actions will be brought to the attention of users of the facility. (See Appendix 3 of this section).

- D. Dissemination of Information on Campus

Every bulletin board on campus will be assigned jointly by the Deans of Student Personnel Services and Instruction to a department,

office, organization, or individual or be given an "open" classification. Use of assigned boards will be at the discretion of the assignee. Boards labeled "open" may be used for publicizing on or off campus events of public interest.

Leaflets and similar material may be freely distributed at outdoor areas which are centers of campus life by campus organizations provided the material has recorded on it the name of the campus organization and the names of the individuals who have written the material. Individuals who desire to distribute materials may request an organization's sponsorship through the Inter-Club Council. The sponsoring organization, together with its adviser, may facilitate the distribution of the materials, without necessarily subscribing to the point of view presented, provided the material has recorded on it the name of the campus organization and the names of the individuals who have written the material.

Off-campus groups or individuals presenting approved assembly-type programs may distribute but not sell literature related to the topic under discussion or the purposes of the organization represented. The literature may be distributed at the location from which the program will be presented and/or continued during a question/answer period.

E. Solicitation of Funds or Donations or Sponsorship of Fund-Raising Activities

The solicitation of funds or donations, or sponsorship of fund-raising activities either on or off campus is permitted only upon approval of the Inter-Club Council, or, in the absence of Inter-Club Council action, upon approval of the Student Activities Advisor. Off-campus groups or individuals presented by an agency of the college are not permitted to sell literature or other items or to collect funds by other means while on the campus. Any campus organization which collects funds from its members or other sources will maintain an account with the Associated Students so proper records are kept for all deposits and disbursements. Use of the funds shall be at the discretion of the organization.

F. Financial Responsibility

Any activity sponsored by a campus organization after approval by the Inter-Club Council is the exclusive financial responsibility of the organization. Any such activity for which the organization does not have required funds on deposit and which involves a commitment of \$50 or more shall be subject to the approval of the Dean, Student Personnel Services. Approval will involve filing by the parties involved of a written statement releasing the college and Associated Students from any financial claim or responsibility.

Sponsors of the various programs and activities have a responsibility to insure that the normal educational program or conduct of the affairs of the college are not disrupted.

Care should be taken to have all authorized programs and events scheduled on the college activities calendar. Provisions for adequate facilities and necessary equipment should be assured well in advance of the activity.

PROPOSAL

Subject: Utilization of the present Student Activities Office Space

Adopted: By the Student Affairs Committee on October 19, 1972  
By the Executive Cabinet, College Student Assembly on October 25, 1972

During the spring semester of 1972, the Student Affairs Committee and the Student Assembly adopted and forwarded to the president of the college a resolution which stated that the present Bookstore and Student Activities Office spaces should be utilized in the future for Student Activities or Student Services. On October 5, 1972, the Student Affairs Committee again unanimously adopted a resolution which proposed that the Bookstore space and Student Activities Office space, when vacated, should be used for Student Activities or Student Services. It is clear to those who have studied the facilities, that the Doyle Student Center should remain a center for student extra-curricular activity.

The basic student proposal is that the present Bookstore facility (in its entirety) should be converted into additional food services, a student lounge and recreation-game room. The food service portion of this facility should take two forms. It is envisioned that there would be a barbeque grill arrangement, in conjunction with a delicatessen or sandwich bar operation. The facility should be so arranged so that the Student Lounge could also serve as a coffee house when desired. In addition, it is proposed that the area from the east side of the Bookstore to the cafeteria be screened off to form a sheltered outdoor eating area.

The second portion of this proposal deals with the present Student Activities Office space. This proposal would designate this space as the location of an on-campus FM Radio Station. This portion of this proposal would be based on the Speech Department's willingness to develop the curriculum in support of a radio broadcasting program and to make arrangements for the faculty person necessary to teach the classes and supervise the station's operation. If the Speech Department is unable, or unwilling to proceed with the establishment of an FM Radio Station, then it is proposed that the offices of the Oak Leaf be moved into the present Student Activities Office space.

It is envisioned that the Student Switchboard operation would continue to be housed in the Doyle Student Center. The present Journalism space should be used for additional direct student services. Included in this area would be a new student housing office.

Statement on Speakers,

Guidelines for a Student Organization Desiring to Sponsor  
an Off-Campus Speaker in an Assembly-Type Program:

1. A request for authorization shall be submitted to the Inter-Club Council Committee on Speakers on a form provided by the Student Activities Advisor. The Student Activities Advisor will act upon the request himself if the Inter-Club Council is unable to act. The Inter-Club Council Committee on Speakers shall decide by a simple majority vote whether or not the requesting club will be allowed to sponsor a given speaker. This decision will be based on the information supplied by the club on the request for authorization form. A copy of this form is attached. The Inter-Club Council Committee on Speakers shall consider the following before coming to a decision:
  - a. What are the merits of the program which make it worthy of public presentation?
  - b. What are the qualifications and affiliations of the speaker?
  - c. Is the subject one which should be assured of a presentation of all points of view?
  - d. Is the speaker more properly presented by the committee for an Open Forum?
  - e. Has a request been submitted to the Committee for an Open Forum for sponsorship of this speaker?
  - f. What problem, if any, do the members of I.C.C. Committee on Speakers or the sponsoring organization foresee which may arise with respect to the proposed program?
  - g. Is the sponsoring organization, its advisor, and the I.C.C. Committee on Speakers willing to accept the responsibility for having this presentation on campus?
2. A facility shall be reserved through the office of the assistant dean of evening college with arrangements made for special needs.
3. The speaker shall be informed:
  - a. Approval for his appearance on campus is granted for the purpose of his speaking on the announced topic for which the request was submitted to the Inter-Club Council.
  - b. The program may or may not be taped depending on whether or not a request originates from an agency or individual on campus (i.e., Committee for an Open

Forum, Student Activities Advisor, or the sponsoring organization).

4. Groups or an individual invited to the campus will be informed of the right to distribute literature related to the topic or to the purpose of the organization and of the prohibition against the sale of literature or other items or the collection of funds. Leaflets and similar materials may be distributed at the location from which the program will be presented and/or continued during a question/answer period or on the patio of the Doyle Student Center by the sponsoring student organization.
5. A member of the sponsoring club or organization or its advisor will preside at each program. He will introduce the speaker and will recognize students for questions upon termination of the presentation. The presiding officer will not allow students to make speeches from the "floor" in lieu of asking questions. In the instance of a presiding student, the club or organization advisor will be present in the audience.
6. Each program will terminate within the hour. A question and answer session, engaging the speaker and students, can be arranged following the general program in a separate meeting area can be scheduled.
7. All programs are open to the total campus community, but the general public is not invited to attend because the purpose of the programs is to provide an opportunity for speakers to address students.
8. Because the sponsoring club or organization and its advisor is responsible for guests during their campus presence, the club or club advisor reserves the right to terminate appearances of guests at any time during which threatened or actual interruptive tactics cause disruption.
9. In the event of anticipated trouble before a program, the club or its organization or its advisor will notify college officials for purposes of developing, cooperatively, precautionary measures.

## BEST CLUB TROPHY AWARD CODE

### I. Presentation of Award

- A. The award shall be presented to the club at the I.C.C. meeting two weeks before "dead week".
- B. The award shall consist of a perpetual plaque on which the name of the Best Club shall be placed, and a small trophy which may be retained by the club receiving the award.

### II. Method of Selecting Best Club

- A. The judging committee shall be composed of: The Dean of Students and the Student Activities Advisor, one member of CSA (to be elected by CSA), and one member of ICC (to be elected by ICC).
- B. It will be the sole responsibility of those clubs participating to present to the judging committee upon request a resume of activities that were done inclusive of the semester being judged.
- C. The judging committee shall use as a guideline for selection, the Best Club Trophy Award Point System set forth in Section III of this code.
- D. The decision of the judging committee shall be final.
- E. An honorable mention may be awarded when deemed necessary for outstanding accomplishment in some specific field.

III. Best Club Trophy Point System:

A. Points will be awarded for each activity under only one of the categories listed as follows:

1. Campus Service Activities ..... (Includes money-making activities that benefit the entire student body. ie., Movies Lectures, Publications, etc.)	5-10




