I. Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 12:14 by ASB Vice-President Greg Gray.

II. Roll Call

III. Approval of Agenda

The agenda was corrected to read Future Lawyers under item VI, a, and approved as corrected.

IV. Approval of Minutes

The minutes were approved as written.

V. Reports

Mr. Canevari apologized for missing the first meeting, re-introduced his assistant (Bob Marmor), and went on to talk about the importance of clubs on campus.

Greg Gray informed members that each club representative had a vote (and forgot to tell them that he did this in order to facilitate business and eliminate 1-1-19 ties).

VI. Old Business

a. Approval of Future Lawyers Club constitution

It was moved and seconded to approve the Future Lawyers Club constitution. Motion passed.

b. From the Floor

There was no old business from the floor.

VII. New Business

a. Approval of Young Republicans constitution (reactivation)

It was moved and seconded to temporarily approve the Young Republicans club pending approval of their constitution next week.

b. Fall 1971 Best Club Award Trophy

On behalf of the Best Club Award committee, Mr. Canevari presented the Best Club Award trophy to the SRJC Vet's Club. The Circle K Club recieved a special services award in recognition of their fund raising for Wendy Bellow. The Ski Club recieved a special services award in recognition of their blood drive for Mike Clarkson.

VII. New Business (continued)

d. Tom Boyd and Joelyn Carr volunteered for service on the I.C.C. Committee on Speakers.

e. J.C.G. Film

Mr. Canevari introduced a film, Jesus Christ Superstar, as a possible club money-making project. The Circle K Club expressed interest.

f. Project Concern - Walk for Mankind

Carolyn Lovelace through Bob Marmor requested club sponsorship for a talk about Project Concern's Walk for Mankind. The Young Republicans volunteered to sponsor her.

g. Bã I.C.C. Rep. to CSA

Darrell Gaebel and Joanne Dall were nominated as I.C.C. Rep. to CSA. In the ensuing vote, Joanne Dall became said rep.

h. From the Floor

1. Tom Boyd was nominated for the position of I.C.C. Vice-Chairman. As the only nominee he was arbitrarily appointed as such.
2. 'Antique' photographer requested (through I.C.C. chairman) a club to sponsor his working on SRJC campus. There were no volunteers at this time.
3. Tom Boyd moved and it was seconded for I.C.C. to send a letter to the Oak Leaf requesting that they send a rep. to I.C.C. meetings as they do to CSA meetings. Motion passed.

Future Lawyers -
FUTURE LAWYERS

Article I Name

Section A. The name of this club will be Future Lawyers.

Article II Purpose

Section A. To examine and consider the aspects of the legal discipline.

Article III Qualifications of members

Section A. This club shall be open to anyone with interests in the legal discipline that is a student of SRJC.

Article IV Offices

Section A. President. The President presides over meetings, appoints committees and handles any other needed appointments that may arise. The President appoints the secretary.

Section B. Secretary. The secretary shall take care of correspondence as well as keep minutes of all regular meetings. He shall be appointed by the President. The secretary will also serve as treasurer.

Section C. Term of office for President and Secretary will be one semester.

Article V Meetings

Section A. Regular meetings will be held every 1st and 3rd Monday at noon when school is in session.

Section B. Special meetings can be called anytime.

Article VI Amending Constitution

Section A. This constitution shall be amended only with the approval of an absolute majority of the total official membership.

Article VII Dues

Section A. Dues will consist of \$2.00 per member per semester. All expenses for field trips and the like may be considered as separate payments.

Article VIII Legislation

Section A. Legislation may only be voted upon with a simple majority of the official members.

Article IX Ratification

Section A. This constitution will be ratified by a 2/3 majority.

- AD HOC STUDENT COMMITTEE CODE -

An Ad Hoc Student Committee (any informal student organization), is a group of students, or a group with students as part of its membership, who organize on a temporary basis for a specific purpose. The membership of such an organization may include SRJC students, SRJC faculty, SRJC administrators, and SRJC staff members.

An Ad Hoc student committee may apply for recognition to the Inter-Club Council of Santa Rosa Junior College. Recognition is granted upon a majority vote of the Inter-Club Council members. The Ad Hoc committee becomes a recognized on-campus organization for a period of time, not to exceed nine consecutive weeks during any one semester. At the conclusion of the first nine weeks period, an Ad Hoc student committee may apply for an extension of a second nine week period.

Once an Ad Hoc student group has been given recognition by the Inter-Club Council, such a group has all of the rights and privileges of an on-campus club, as shown in the Inter-Club Council Code. Ad Hoc student groups, however, do not have a vote in the Inter-Club Council.

An Ad Hoc student committee must have a faculty advisor and must submit to the Inter-Club Council an information sheet showing the name of the organizer of the committee, the name of the faculty advisor, the name of the student chairman, or president, and a brief statement of purpose. Once Ad Hoc student committee status has been obtained, the group need not send a representative to the Inter-Club Council meetings on a regular basis.

Whenever an Ad Hoc student committee wishes to sponsor a money-making activity of any kind, it must file a money-making request with the Inter-Club Council. The decision of the Inter-Club Council will be made by a majority vote of that body.

If an Ad Hoc student committee wishes to sponsor an off-campus speaker, who is invited to address the student body in an assembly type program, it must follow the procedure as outlined in the policy statement on speakers, solicitation of funds, and dissemination of information on campus, which is Section 6.10 of the Administrative Handbook. An Ad Hoc student committee must also abide by all campus policies regarding the distribution of literature and the dissemination of information.



BALLET MECHANIQUE Classic example of dadaistic surrealism produced by Fernand Leger during the Avantgarde Film Movement in France during the 1920's. (13 min.)

BAGS Polish animator Tadeusz Wilkosz uses an attic of discarded household objects to portray a conflict that reaches far beyond the dimensions of its own setting. (9 min.)

METANOMEN San Francisco filmmaker Scott Bartlett's first film is a stark black and white human story set against a background of abstract machines. Techniques used include negative images, high contrast, double image, and divided frame. (1966 8 min.)

SUGGESTIONS REGARDING CLUB CONSTITUTIONS

When writing a new constitution, or revising an old one, observe that at least seven main articles are usually included. (See Sturgis, Alice F. "Learning Parliamentary Procedure", or "Sturgis Standard Code of Parliamentary Procedure".) The seven standard articles are as follows:

(A Preamble, if desired, may preface the constitution.)

ARTICLE I Name of the organization

ARTICLE II Purposes and powers of the organization

ARTICLE III Qualifications of members

ARTICLE IV List of officers of the organization, their duties, and the term of office.

ARTICLE V Provides for a Board of Directors or Executive Committee. (This article may be omitted if it does not apply to the organization.)

ARTICLE VI States the time for regular meetings and provides a method by which special meetings may be called.

ARTICLE VII States methods of amending the constitution

Often included as part of the Constitution, at the end, are the Bylaws. These include any or all of the following: Kinds of membership, requirements, method of admitting members, dues, powers and duties of officers in detail, election of officers and committees, including the vote required for election, provisions for calling and conducting meetings, parliamentary authority, number constituting a quorum, vote required for important decisions, procedures for amending Bylaws.

The next page gives a sample of a club constitution for your reference.

HUI O HAWAII CONSTITUTION

I. CLUB NAME

- A. The name of this organization shall be Hui O Hawaii of Santa Rosa Junior College.

II. PURPOSE

- A. To promote good will and friendship between students of Hawaii and Santa Rosa Junior College.

III. MEMBERSHIP

- A. Membership is open to any holder of a current Santa Rosa Junior College Student Body Card.
- B. Dues shall be one dollar (\$1.00) per month, and a new member shall pay three dollars (\$3.00) registration fee upon joining.

IV. MEETINGS

- A. Meetings are to be held on Tuesday, twelve noon until one p.m. of each week during the school year, unless otherwise called by the President of Hui O Hawaii.

V. OFFICERS, DUTIES

- A. THE PRESIDENT, shall be the presiding officer at club meetings and affairs, and have the power to call together committees for any purpose.
- B. THE VICE-PRESIDENT, shall take the Presidents place during his absences.
- C. (THE PRESIDENT AND VICE-PRESIDENT shall be ex-officio members of all club committees).
- D. THE SECRETARY, shall keep all club records of meetings and affairs other than monetary.
- E. THE TREASURER, shall keep account and be responsible for all club monies.
- F. THE PARLIAMENTARIAN, shall keep order in club meetings and advise all other club members of proper meeting procedures.

VI. ELECTION OF OFFICERS

- A. All officers are elected for a term of one (1) semester.
- B. All officers are ineligible to hold the same office for two or more semesters in a row.
- C. PRESIDENT and SECRETARY must have been a legal resident of hawaii at some time during their lives.

X. Amendments

- A. This constitution can be amended by a two-thirds vote of all current club members.
- B. An amendment must be proposed by committee.
- C. No amendment shall come in conflict with the constitution of Santa Rosa Junior College Student Body or any of the establishments thereof.

XI. ORDER

- A. Roberts Rule of Order will be the official guide for club meeting procedure.

SUBJECT: Club Selectivity

It is well known that your group (ICC) has been struggling for some time with the difficult problem of club selectivity. Our Board of Trustees has several times considered the matter and has delineated what they mean by open membership, spirit and compliance, and no selectivity. I sympathize greatly with your problem and recognize that further clarification or interpretation of the Board policy is necessary. Therefore, assuming the prerogative of interpretation of a Board policy, I would like to make several comments relative to club selectivity on the Santa Rosa Junior College campus.

In order to be very sure that we talk about the same thing may I quote from the minutes of the meeting of the Board of Trustees of February 9, 1967, to wit:

"On a motion by trustee Plover, seconded by trustee Lounibos, and carried, the Board of Trustees re-affirms its action of May 14, 1965 wherein the Board stated: 'The official policy of this college to be that student clubs shall not exercise selectivity of membership based on vote of their members and further that the Board interprets the policy to prohibit the use of any device or practice which in effect implements selectivity, and, further that the board expects compliance in spirit and fact with the policy of open membership.'"

I believe that the most significant feature of this interpretation hinges on the words "expects compliance in spirit and fact with the policy of open membership." I say this because I must recognize that there is a kind of natural selectivity that takes place within any club. This natural selectivity may take different avenues of expression. For example, should a student choose to become a member of a particular club where he/she has no particular interest or does not like what goes on within the club

a natural selectivity takes over and the student soon terminates his membership. Again, even though we would deplore it, natural selectivity operates in any organization where a potential member or new member is ostracized or receives the "cold shoulder" from those then in membership. Finally, and many other kinds of examples could be noted, there is a type of natural selectivity that takes place within clubs organized around a particular focus such as similarity of academic interests, similarity of past experience, etc., and it is to this final point to which I would now turn your attention.

In order to delineate and to make very clear that I interpret to mean "open membership" I would state that the spirit about which the Board speaks and the democracy to which we all pay lip service is at issue when any student is denied membership in an organization which should be open to him by the very fact that he is a member of the total student body. The implication of a fraternity or a sorority of a type or a kind has no place upon the junior college campus and in fact is forbidden under the State Education Code (Section 10604-Membership in Secret Clubs.)

It is my interpretation that certain clubs and organizations have a rather natural selectivity by the very nature of their composition. I shall attempt to state what I think these are and to give examples of specific clubs. Please note that each of the following examples embodies the principles laid down by the Board ("no device or practice which limits membership" and "no vote is necessary to join"). Rather, each example stresses what we might refer to as "a fact accompli" -- that is, a condition which already exists.

1. Alpha Gamma Sigma AGS is an honorary society which has a natural selectivity in that the condition already exists wherein a member has earned the right to be a member.
2. A.W.S., M.L.C., W.I.C., and other similar clubs certainly have a natural selectivity by the very fact that all students must decide whether they are male or female.
3. The Veterans Club -- you will note here that no vote is necessary for one to join but that one earns the right through past performance and for a condition which already existed prior to their membership into that organization.
4. Clubs and organizations such as Medical Assisting, Dental Assisting, French, etc., may or may not have a type of natural selectivity. Certainly, I could understand a student having the necessary tool of the language in order to actively participate in a French club meeting and yet, on the other hand, I can see a certain value of any student being able to participate in the club in the hope that he might become interested enough to become a member of that organization. It would seem to me that a club which is "curriculum" oriented should determine for themselves which approach it will take.

Finally, and conclusion, it is my judgment that the interpretation contained herein falls within the Board's opinion that clubs should have open membership -- particularly applying to clubs organized around social pursuits -- and that they should not restrict their membership by any device or practice which implements selectivity. I do not believe that the exceptions that I have noted here are devices or are practices which

effect selectivity. They are facts which cannot be legislated away by any declaration of open membership. It is my intention to forward this memorandum to each member of our Board of Trustees and to solicit their reaction. Until such time as they either negate or sustain this pronouncement the I.C.C., I trust, shall abide by it.

Please feel free to discuss this matter with me at your convenience.

BOARD STATEMENT ON SELECTIVITY -- February 9, 1967

The Board of Trustees reaffirm its action of May 14, 1965, wherein the Board stated the official policy of this college to be that student clubs shall not exercise selectivity of membership based on vote of their members, and further that the Board interprets the policy to prohibit the use of any device or practice which in effect implements selectivity, and further, that the Board expects compliance in spirit and fact with the policy of open membership.

There shall be established at Santa Rosa Junior College a permanent organization of students, clubs, and organizations known as the Inter-Club Council.

THE INTER-CLUB COUNCIL CODE

I. The Membership of the Inter-Club Council

- a. Each recognized club on campus shall be represented by two members, one active and one alternative; each club having one vote.
- b. Any clubs not represented at two consecutive meetings or three intermittent meetings, shall be automatically subject to a fine of \$5.00. If the club fails to pay the fine within two weeks of notification, the club shall lose all recognition by I.C.C. until the following semester.
- c. Special members to the I.C.C. shall include the Student Activities Advisor and Parliamentarian who are ex-officio members.

II. Officers of the Inter-Club Council

- a. The chairman of the I.C.C. shall be the Associated Students Vice-President. The Vice-Chairman shall be appointed by the Chairman from the I.C.C. membership and with the approval of I.C.C.
- b. The Chairman: Shall preside over all meetings. He shall have the power to appoint special committees and call emergency meetings. He shall have a vote only to make or break a tie.
- c. The Vice-Chairman: Shall preside in the absence of the chairman, and shall be a voting member.
- d. The Secretary: Shall be appointed by the chairman with the approval of I.C.C. and shall keep all minutes of the meetings.

III. The Purpose of the Inter-Club Council

- a. I.C.C. shall have the sole responsibility of legislating and enforcing rules in anything regarding clubs.
- b. Club Constitutions and by-laws will be submitted to the Inter-Club Council annually at the last meeting of the Spring Semester for approval. New constitutions for clubs or organizations and/or by-laws and/or amendments shall be submitted to the Constitution Committee, then to the various clubs

VI. Amendments for their consideration, and finally to I.C.C. for action. The Constitutions, new or amended, must be in the Club mail boxes by ten o'clock the day of the Club meetings so they may be submitted for approval at the following I.C.C. meeting. Club constitutions should comply with all state laws. A simple majority vote of I.C.C. is necessary for approval of Constitutions if two-thirds of the total voting members are present.

- c. To plan a social calendar of activities in cooperation with the Student Activities Advisor, and correlate it with the College Student Assembly Activities Calendar.

VII. This To give guidance to new organizations on the campus in such matters as procedures for getting started, drawing up constitutions, and conducting their affairs.

(I.C.C. Code - Paragraph III - Con't.)

- e. To organize an orientation program during registration and throughout the semester, in order to interest and assist new students in functioning as members of a club.

IV. Meetings

- a. Regular meetings shall be held weekly at a time and place set at the discretion of the chairman. Special meetings shall be posted in club mail boxes two (2) days prior to special meetings.
- b. Three-fifths of the members of the I.C.C. and the Student Activities Advisor shall constitute a quorum at any I.C.C. meeting.

V. Club Membership

- a. Any student wishing to become a member of a particular club will sign up at the Activities Booth on Club Day, or with a particular club within the time limit set by the individual clubs' constitution.
- b. Clubs may not restrict their membership. No club may use any device or practice which in effect implements selectivity.
 - 1. All clubs who maintain a system to determine active and inactive members, and who subsequently use this system to include or exclude members shall apply this evaluating system to all members.
- c. Two weeks after Club Day, each ASB club will submit to the I.C.C. chairman a list of present members.
- d. All active club members must be registered students at Santa Rosa Junior College.
- e. If a club is found guilty by a majority vote of the members of I.C.C. of practicing any form of selectivity against a prospective member, that club will be subject to a fine of \$10.00 and must also accept the prospective member if he or she still desires membership. If the said club does not pay the fine within two weeks after they have been found guilty of the violation by I.C.C., that club will be refused recognition by I.C.C. for the balance of the current semester.
- f. The I.C.C. shall have the right to enforce the above stipulations in any way they choose within the bounds of the ASB constitution.

VI. Amendments

- a. These by-laws can be amended by a two-thirds vote of the I.C.C. Submitting of proposals and the voting thereon shall not be done at the same meeting.
- b. These amendments become operative upon acceptance by the College Student Assembly.

VII. This code shall become effective when approved by the College Student Assembly.

CHARTER
for

THE INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS CLUB
of Santa Rosa Junior College

* * * * *

I. INTRODUCTION

The ideals of the International Relations Club of Santa Rosa Junior College shall be:

- (1) To aid the international students at SRJC in any possible way,
- (2) To invite more international students to attend, and
- (3) To establish traditions of sharing customs, ideas, and viewpoints with them.

II. MEMBERSHIP

- (1) GENERAL MEMBERSHIP shall be open to any student of SRJC upon payment of dues and agreement with the principles of the organization, with affiliate membership open to the faculty and the invited public.
- (2) This general membership shall meet at least once a month.

III. GOVERNING COMMITTEE

The leadership of the club shall be entrusted to a GOVERNING COMMITTEE consisting of Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Secretary-Treasurer, and at least three committee heads and/or representatives of the general membership which shall meet at least once a week to plan activities and meetings of the general membership, and to hear committee reports and suggestions.

IV. OFFICERS

- (1) The duties of the Chairman shall be to preside over all club meetings and governing committee meetings, to appoint committees, and to be in nominal authority over all other club functions.

- (2) The duties of the Vice-Chairman shall be to take the place of the Chairman in case of his absence, and to serve as representative to the Associated Student Council.
- (3) The duties of the Secretary-Treasurer shall be to take brief minutes of meetings of the general membership, to conduct official correspondence, and to handle club funds, dues, and accounts.
- (4) The Faculty Advisor shall participate in the club government at his own discretion.

V. DUES

- (1) Dues shall be levied at a rate of \$1.00 per semester.
- (2) If a member is ~~derelict~~ ^{behind} ^{← as part of constitution 7/25/65} in payment of dues for a semester, or if he misses three general meetings in a semester, he shall be stricken from the rolls.

VI. AMENDMENT

Amendment of this Charter may be proposed by unanimous vote of the governing committee, or by petition of 1/4 of the enrolled membership, and will be ratified by 3/4 vote.

VII. BY-LAW

(1) INTERNATIONAL AFFILIATION

During the first semester of its existence, the club shall debate affiliation with some international student organization such as People-To-People. At the end of that time it shall decide by 3/4 vote whether or not to join, or to defer the decision another semester.

(2) STANDING COMMITTEE

The Chairman shall appoint such standing committees as are necessary for the club's operation, the minimum to be:

- (1) Correspondence--to write to prospective foreign students,
- (2) Publicity--to publicize club's activities to students and the public,
- (3) Hospitality--to help secure accommodations and employment for international students if needed, and
- (4) Local Affairs--to investigate local activities, plan trips, and plan presentations to introduce students to America.

PRESENTATION OF REPUBLICAN VIEWPOINTS TO THE STUDENT BODY ON CAMPUS.

SECTION III.

PARTICIPATION IN POLITICAL CAMPAIGNS OF REPUBLICAN CANDIDATES ON AND OFF CAMPUS.

ARTICLE III.

MEMBERSHIP SHALL BE OPEN TO ANY MEMBER OF THE STUDENT BODY OF SANTA ROSA JUNIOR COLLEGE WHO IS INTERESTED IN POLITICS AND THE REPUBLICAN PARTY.

ARTICLE IV

OFFICERS OF THE YOUNG REPUBLICANS SHALL CONSIST OF CHAIRMAN, VICE-CHAIRMAN, SECRETARY, TREASURER, AND PUBLIC RELATIONS CHAIRMAN. EX-OFFICIO MEMBERS SHALL BE FACULTY ADVISOR (S).

ARTICLE IV, SECTION I.

THE DUTIES OF CHAIRMAN SHALL BE TO PRESIDE OVER MEETINGS AND TO APPOINT TEMPORARY OFFICERS TO FILL VACANCIES WITH APPROVAL OF THE MAJORITY OF THE MEMBERSHIP. (EXCLUDING THE OFFICES LISTED UNDER ARTICLE IV). THE CHAIRMAN SHALL APPOINTE FACULTY ADVISOR AND INTER CLUB COUNCIL REPRESENTATIVE.

SECTION II.

THE TREASURER SHALL HANDLE ALL FINANCIAL MATTERS IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE ASSOCIATED STUDENTS FINANCIAL CODE.

SECTION V.

THE PUBLIC RELATIONS CHAIRMAN SHALL PUBLICIZE ALL MEETINGS AND ACTIVITIES.

ARTICLE V

FACULTY ADVISOR(S) SHALL BE SELECTED BY THE CHAIRMAN AND APPROVED OF BY THE GENERAL MEMBERSHIP.

ARTICLE VI

SECTION I.



ART. I. NAME

THE NAME SHALL BE "YOUNG DEMOCRATS OF SRJC"

ART. II. OBJECTIVES

SEC. 1. TO ENCOURAGE STUDENT INTEREST IN CURRENT POLITICAL
THOUGHT.

SEC. 2. TO AROUSE STUDENT PARTICIPATION IN POLITICAL AFFAIRS
ON CAMPUS.

SEC. 3. THE PARAMOUNT INTEREST OF THIS ORGANIZATION IS TO
COORDINATE STUDENT ACTIVITIES WITH COMMUNITY, STATE,
AND NATIONAL POLITICS.

ART. III. MEMBERSHIP

SEC. 1. MEMBERS MUST BE REGISTERED OR INTEND TO REGISTER IN
THE DEMOCRATIC PARTY AND MUST BE CURRENT MEMBERS OF
THE ASSOCIATED STUDENTS OF SRJC; HOWEVER, ALL MEMBERS
OF THE SRJC STUDENT BODY MAY BECOME ASSOCIATE MEMBERS.

SEC. 2. EACH MEMBER RESERVES THE RIGHT TO DISAGREE WITH CLUB




Bring the War Home

The past week of anti-war activities has brought on vicious attacks by Nixon mouthpieces on the peace movement in this country. The present administration is afraid of the effects of a powerful anti-war movement that is increasingly moving towards a multi-issue approach to the struggle for peace & justice within the United States. The never-ending war in Indochina is first and foremost a racist war. The totality of the Nixon administration's policy in Vietnam has been to replace American lives with the deaths of hundreds of thousands of Vietnamese, this is called "Vietnamization". The only way the U.S. government has been able to force its will on the peoples of Indochina is through a policy of genocide. This is what is behind the newest escalation, as Nixon tries to desperately cover up the failure of "Vietnamization" with the threat of a world war. It is because the anti-war movement in this country has revealed this "secret" to the American people that Nixon has likewise stepped up his attacks on it. Now is the time for all of us to speak out as never before in opposition to the war and to Nixon's policies at home.

Here in Sonoma County we are preparing new actions against the widening war in Indochina. These actions will be built upon our activities of last week. The most successful of these was a march & rally in Santa Rosa last Thursday. At this rally we demanded that the Press Democrat print the complete text of the Provisional Revolutionary Government of South Vietnam's 7 Point Peace Plan, in order to help overcome one blatant lie of the Nixon administration - that it has been the Vietnamese people who have stalled the Paris talks. In reality it has been the U.S. that refuses to negotiate in good faith by refusing to drop the puppet government of the Thieu regime. This failure has prolonged the war and led to the increased U.S. escalation of the war in Vietnam. In response to the demand of the 1000 marchers in Santa Rosa and over 500 signatures on a petition we succeeded in getting the PD to print the full text of the 7 Points (see Press Democrat, Friday, May 12, page 5).

This coming week we intend to present anti-war resolutions to the Santa Rosa & the Cotati City Councils. We are asking for all persons interested in furthering anti-war actions to attend these City Council meetings. In Santa Rosa the City Council will be meeting Tuesday, May 16. We are calling for a DEMONSTRATION at the OLD COURTHOUSE SQUARE at 7 PM in Santa Rosa (4th & Mendocino). After a short rally we intend to march the two blocks to the City Council meeting where we will present our anti-war resolution. The Cotati City Council will be meeting Thursday at the Cotati City Hall (Pink school) at 7:30 pm.

To prepare for these and for future actions, especially the 20th, there will be an emergency meeting MONDAY at 8 PM at the Sonoma County Bugle office, 428 Fifth Street (545-5011). At Sonoma State College there will be a meeting to discuss future actions on TUESDAY in the Quiet Lounge at NOON.

Other up-coming anti-war actions include:

- WEDNESDAY May 17 - a People's Blockade of SF Bay at the Oakland Army Terminal the army terminal is to be interdicted by a militant traffic block and a naval blockade by the greater Bay area peace armada.
Wednesday in the morning.
- SATURDAY May 20 - RALLY in SAN JOSE for an End to War, Racism & Repression at NOON time at the WILLIAM ST. PARK (South 16th & East William St.). Speakers to include: Angela Davis, Ralph Abernathy, Mayor Hatcher & Father Dan Berrigan.
- MONDAY May 22 - present to the Sonoma County Board of Supervisors an anti-war resolution...more on this later...

BEST CLUB TROPHY AWARD CODE

I. Presentation of Award

- A. The award shall be presented to the club at the I.C.C. meeting two weeks before "dead week".
- B. The award shall consist of a perpetual plaque on which the name of the Best Club shall be placed, and a small trophy which may be retained by the club receiving the award.

II. Method of Selecting Best Club

- A. The judging committee shall be composed of: the Dean of Students, Student Activities Advisor, one member of CSA (to be elected by CSA), and one member of ICC (to be elected by ICC).
- B. It will be the sole responsibility of those clubs participating to present to the judging committee upon request a resume of activities that were done inclusive of the semester being judged.
 1. Resumes must include material which substantiates the activity.
 2. Resumes must be organized according to the structure of the point system by which judging will be guided.
- C. The judging committee shall use as a guideline for selection, the Best Club Trophy Award Point System set forth in Section III of this code.
- D. The decision of the judging committee shall be final.
- E. An honorable mention may be awarded when deemed necessary for outstanding accomplishment in some specific field.

111. Best Club Trophy Point System:

A. Points will be awarded for each activity under only one of the categories listed as follows:

	Points
1. Campus Service Activities..... (Includes money-making activities that benefit the entire student body. ie., Movies Lectures, Publications, etc.)	5-10
2. Donations to the College or Student Body..... (Includes gifts which benefit the college society. ie., books, audio visual equipment, Engineers' Stones, etc.)	5-15
3. Community Service Activities	
Major..... (Includes charitable acts or donations.)	10-20
Minor..... (Includes general assistance to functions pertaining to the community.)	5-10
4. Extended Service Activities..... (Includes those activities that are continued for the entire semester. They must be of a service nature.)	5-15
5. Competition Activities	
a. Sponsorship..... (ie. Queen contests, rallies, athletic tournaments, etc)	5-10
b. Participation.....	5
c. Each Activity Won.....	10
6. Representation at Club Day.....	5
7. Homecoming	
a. Sponsoring queen candidate.....	5
b. Sponsoring of elected queen..... additional	10
c. Sponsoring of elected attendants..... additional	5
8. Bear Fair	
a. Sponsoring queen candidate.....	5
