





Giving blood is a lifesaver

Donating blood is one way to have a personal role in saving lives.

Donors at the Sonoma County Community Blood Bank may be solving a crisis for someone else.

Yet the blood bank has shortages of even common blood types. Regular donors are kept on an emergency call list.

And volunteers maintaining business, club or family accounts often feel like vampires when they have to urge members to donate.

A pint of blood serves many purposes including use through hospitals for accident victims and surgery cases and laboratory removal of cryo or clotting factors for use by hemophi-

liacs or bleeders.

Another benefit through the blood bank is establishment of school, business, club and family accounts. Donors then credit their donation, no more than five times a year, to the account.

As the number of donations or credits increases, members and families are guaranteed units of blood toward the possibility of need in the future. The major requirement to maintain an account is at least one donation to the account per year, but it pays to build up the number.

Many businesses, families and groups have their own accounts through the blood bank.

Santa Rosa Junior College Associated Students and the Campus Police Association, for example, held a blood drive on the campus today. The blood bank, 1428 Montgomery Drive, will send a mobile unit for such drives.

No appointment is necessary to visit the blood bank or donate. It's an easy way to have blood pressure checked and learn one's blood type.




